Background and Methodology

Patrick E. Gonzales graduated magna cum laude from the University of Baltimore with a degree in political science.

His career in the field of public opinion research began in the mid-1980s as an analyst with *Mason-Dixon Opinion Research*. During this time, Mr. Gonzales helped develop, craft and implement election surveys and exit polls for television and radio in the Baltimore-Washington D.C. metro area.

Mr. Gonzales has polled and analyzed well over a thousand elections in Maryland and across the country since that time. Furthermore, he and his associates have conducted numerous market research projects, crafting message development plans and generating strategy blueprints for businesses and organizations throughout the state.

Over his decades of conducting public opinion polls, Patrick Gonzales has been widely recognized by his peers for his ability to conduct unbiased surveys, and analyze the results in an impartial, evenhanded manner.

Mr. Gonzales appears frequently on radio and television in the Baltimore-D.C. region as a guest commentator.

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This poll was conducted by *Gonzales Research & Media Services* from December 20th through December 30th, 2021. A total of 807 registered voters in Maryland who vote regularly were queried by live telephone interviews, utilizing both landline and cell phone numbers. A cross-section of interviews was conducted throughout the state, reflecting general election voting patterns.

The margin of error (MOE), per accepted statistical standards, is a range of plus or minus 3.5 percentage points. If the entire population was surveyed, there is a 95% probability that the true numbers would fall within this range.


Gonzales Maryland Poll – January 2022 Results

Medical Aid in Dying

Among Maryland voters, 69% believe that a mentally sound adult with an incurable, terminal illness, who only has six months or less to live, should have the legal option of medical aid in dying, while 20% oppose this, with 11% offering no opinion.

Marylanders within every demographic group support the legal option of medical aid in dying to get the prescription medication to take to pass peacefully:

Medical Aid In Dying by Region


Fifty-seven percent of Free State voters say they would want the option of medical aid in dying if they had an incurable, terminal illness, and had less than six months to live, 35% say they would not, and 8% provide no response.

Sixty-one percent of men and 54% of women would want the legal option of medical aid in dying, if they had an incurable, terminal illness, and had less than six months to live.

When told that 10 of the 50 states and Washington, D.C. have the option of medical aid in dying, 73% support Maryland having this legal option, also.

Voters within every demographic group think that Maryland should join the 10 other states and Washington, D.C. in having the legal option of medical aid in dying by allowing mentally sound adults with an incurable, terminal illness, who have only six months or less to live, to get prescription medication they may take to pass peacefully in their sleep.
